


With one heart and one passion, let us put our hand to the work of resurrection...

The July 12 morning prayer is a reflection on the washing of feet, icon of our community life. The washing of feet and the institutions of the Eucharist are intimately linked. We are called to eat the Body of Christ to enable us to wash each others feet. This ritual is a gesture which speaks of service, of communion, of mutual forgiveness, of co-existence, of unity.

It is a sign of respect for the body, the Temple of God. As Jean Vanier states so well: "It reveals us to ourselves". To concretize the symbolic prayer, there follows a washing of hands at each table in the Chapter Hall. With reverence and great respect, we live this gesture of fraternal love in memory of Jesus who came to teach us to serve and to love.
